

# Foal Documentation Collection Guide

## 1. Identification Documents

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- Breed registration papers
- Microchip information (if applicable)
- DNA test results for parentage verification

Tip: Always keep copies of original documents in a safe place.

## 2. Health Records

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- Vaccination records
- Deworming schedule and history
- Health certificates
- Veterinary examination reports

Tip: Maintain a detailed health journal for your foal.

## 3. Pedigree Information

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- Sire's registration and performance records
- Dam's registration and performance records
- Extended pedigree chart (if available)

## 4. Growth and Development Records

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- Birth weight and measurements
- Regular height and weight measurements
- Photos documenting growth stages

Tip: Take measurements and photos at consistent intervals for accurate tracking.

## 5. Training and Behavior Notes

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- Early handling experiences
- Milestone achievements (e.g., first halter, first hoof trim)
- Temperament assessments

## 6. Nutritional Information

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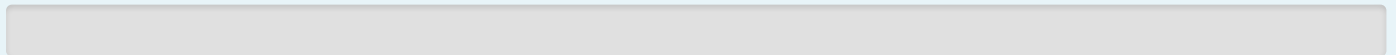
- Feeding schedule and amounts
- Types of feed and supplements used
- Any dietary restrictions or special needs

## 7. Show or Performance Records (if applicable)

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- Entry forms and results from foal shows
- Judge's comments or scorecards
- Photos or videos from events
